Dear Friends and Colleagues:

We are pleased to present our first Report on Activities. While JSF was founded in the summer of 2014, our first two years were focused mostly on getting established. Specifically, we:

- Incorporated as a non-profit organization
- Recruited board members
- Refined our mission
- Developed by-laws
- Raised startup funds.

During our first operational year, June 2016 – May 2017, we were pleased with the programs we were able to implement. We offered:

- A Cricket Camp
- A Rec Volleyball Clinic
- Rec Org Leadership Training
- Partnered with the Rec Orgs Community to promote and cover youth sports in the Sun Newspaper
- Awarded \$600 in grants to the HHS girls and boys Volleyball Booster Clubs

In our second year of operation we expanded our offerings. We:

- Partnered with the Positive Coaching Alliance (PCA) to offer training and on-line resources to rec coaches.
- Awarded a \$1500 grant to the Hershey Aquatic Club to provide training for female swimmers.
- Provided sponsorships of \$100 each to Hershey High School Golf and Basketball Teams.
- Initiated a High School Rec Volleyball Program.
- Initiated High School Flag Football League.
- Held a Sports Sampling Camp.
- Hosted the First Annual Rec Volunteer Recognition dinner.

With a few years of operation and fund-raising experience under our belt, we are pleased to announce that our focus for June 2018 through May 2019 will be to:


- **Continue** our partnership with the Positive Coaching Alliance to offer resources for coaches, parents and athletes.

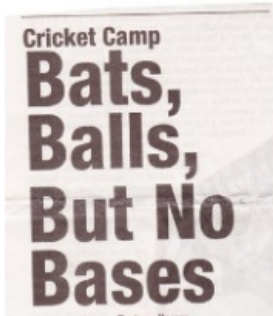

Collaboration

JSF initiated three key steps to strengthen collaboration and communication with key stake holders throughout Derry Township.

1. Created a JSF website and Facebook page to promote rec sports and facilitate collaboration among rec organizations.
2. Invested in a 12-month partnership with The Sun to cover and promote rec sports on a monthly basis so that youth programs in the community were recognized more often.
3. Established a partnership with the Positive Coaching Alliance to deliver rec coaching training and valuable on-line resources to the Derry Township Recreation community of coaches, parents and athletes.

Partnerships with the Derry Township School District, the Township of Derry, Derry Township Rec Organizations and the Milton Hershey School have been invaluable in promoting JSF's activities and providing facilities.
